



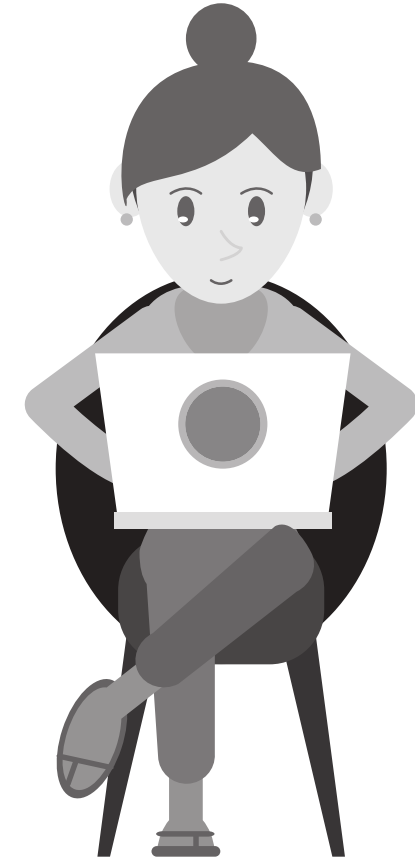
## Scenario 1

These include:

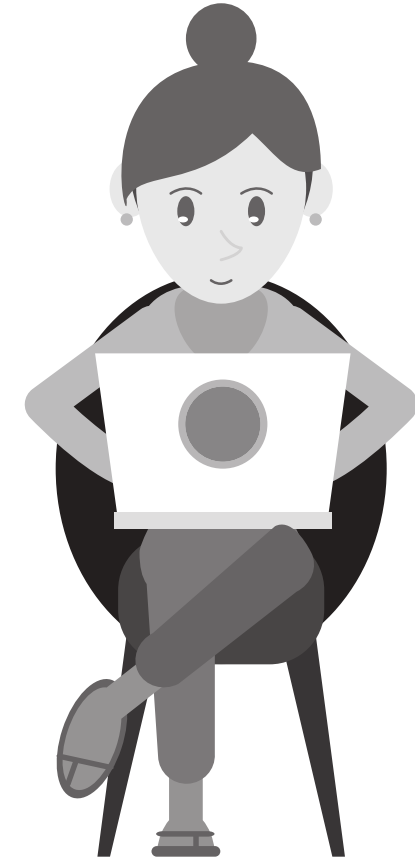
**“Xenovians are disgusting -

3. Can you think of some reasons why Kelsie might have felt that way?



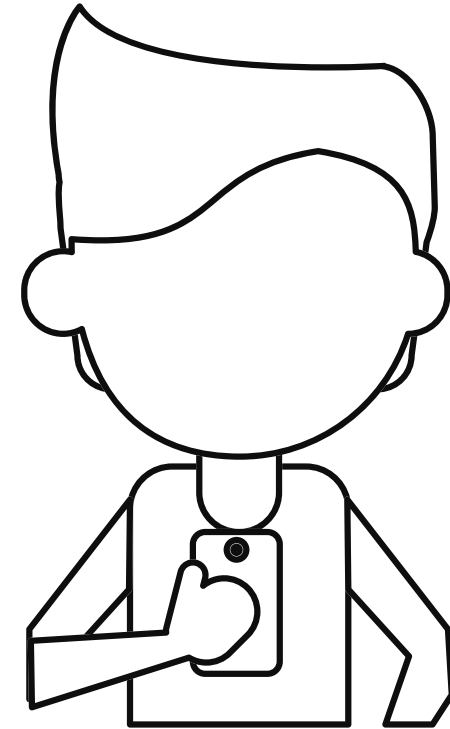


## Scenario 2

He's not got any particular view on Xenovians...

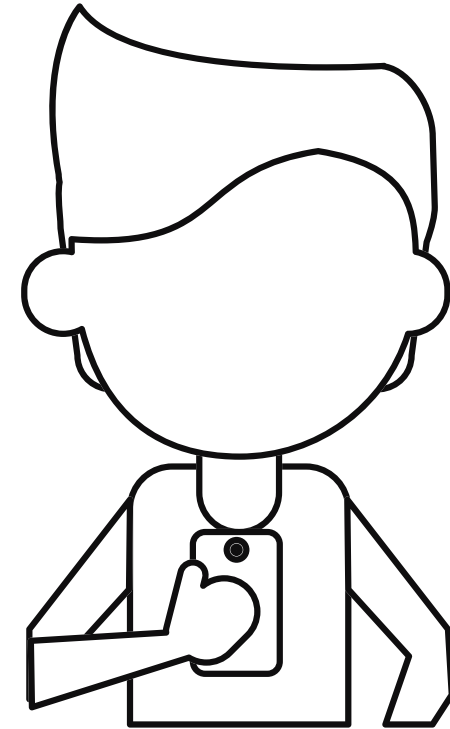
... but he 'likes' Kelsie's post.

2. Do you think it matters that Sam 'liked' Kelsie's post? If so, why? If not, why not?

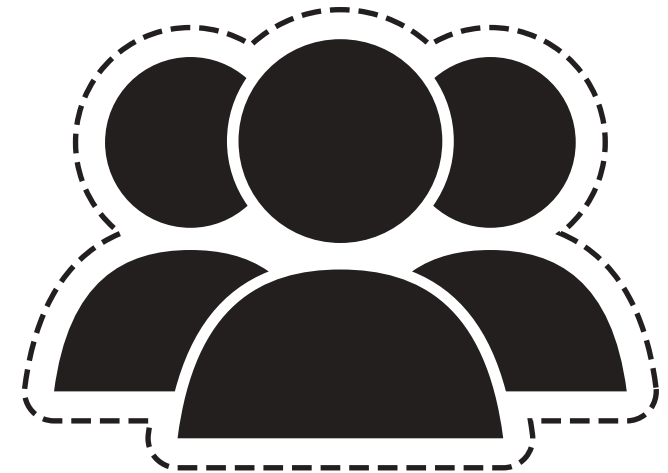




## Scenario 3

Sam receives a private message on social media from someone he does not recognise.

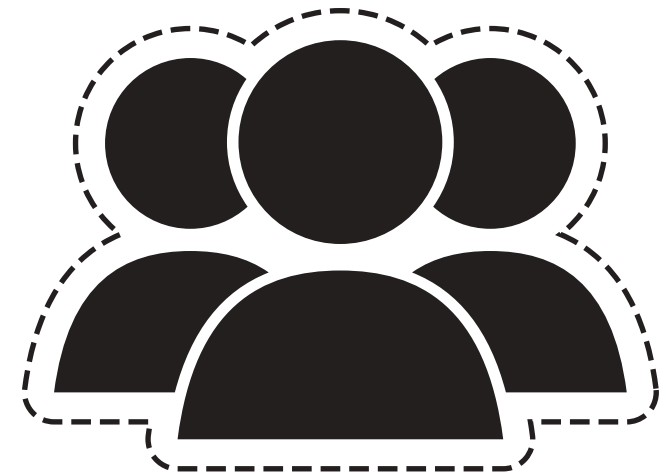

3. Do you think Sam should meet them for a chat? Why/why not?

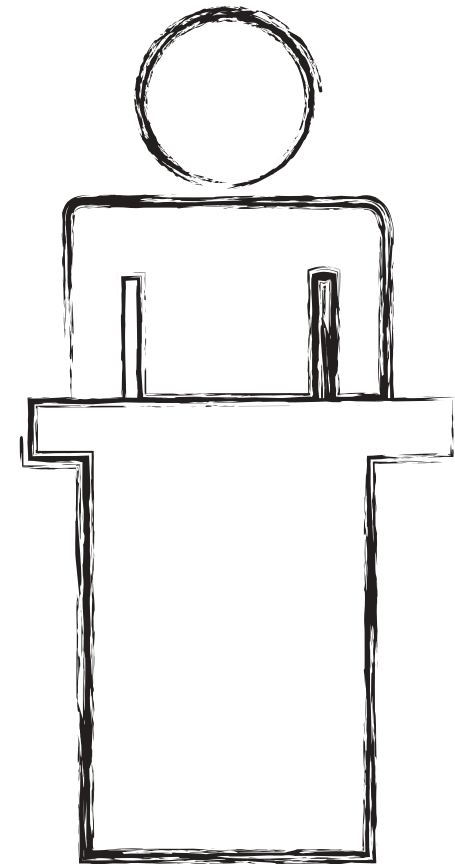




## Scenario 4
